EPA Extending Storm Water Construction General Permit by One Year



In order to give itself enough time to incorporate its [new final rule requirements](#) regarding effluent limitations for the construction and development industry, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is extending the 2008 storm water construction general permit to June 30, 2011. The permit applies only where the EPA is the permitting authority: Idaho, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Mexico and Washington, D.C., as well as most territories and Indian country lands.

EPA Busy Finding CWA Violators in Mississippi

Construction projects throughout Mississippi drew attention - and reprimands for Clean Water Act (CWA) violations - from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) during the last quarter of 2009. Among those the EPA heard from were:

- Wrigleyville Development Company, Inc., for violations at Wrigleyville subdivision in Gulfport, Miss.
- Pontotoc Union Lee Alliance, L & T Construction, Inc., and Eutlaw Construction Company, Inc., for violations along the Blue Springs Rail Spur and Blue Springs North Loop Interchange in Blue Springs, Miss.
- Trinity Development Group, Ltd., for violations at the Cypress Landing subdivision in Gautier, Miss.

The EPA is requiring these violators to adjust their Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plans, modify their Notice of Intent for Permit coverage, establish inspection programs and address areas of potential discharges.

Dandy Facts

1. Saint Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, was not born Irish. His birthplace is said to be either in Roman England or in Scotland.
2. The first civic and public celebration of St. Patrick's Day in the 13 colonies took place in Boston, Massachusetts in 1737.
3. St. Patrick's Day was celebrated only as a religious holiday in Ireland until 1903, when an act introduced by Irish MP James O'Mara made it a public holiday. O'Mara later introduced a law requiring pubs to be closed on St. Patrick's Day, and that law was repealed only in the 1970s.
4. About 1.8 billion pints of GUINNESS® stout are sold each year throughout the world.
5. Years ago in Ireland, the color blue, not green, was associated with St. Patrick's Day.
